Awareness

Regulatory Compliance

R&D

Procurement

- build sustainability considerations into procurement processes
- inform on environmental, social and economic performance

Accountability

- cooperate with shareholders to investigate, develop and promote the benefits of ICT for sustainable development

Cooperation

- implement an environmental management system

Management systems

- develop programmes on environmental protection, labour conditions, occupational health and safety and social accountability

Employee relations

- create a work environment based on work-life balance, professional development, diversity, health and safety.
